#### **Reading Readiness:**

- Read together frequently
- Practice writing simple sound-spelled words
- Practice sight words
- Write letters of the alphabet


### Math Preparation:

- Practice math facts
- Use Reflex math program three times per week for 15 minutes
- Complete math activities from the summer calendar

**Motivation Tip:** If your child completes 50 activities from the summer calendar, they can bring it back to Mrs. Hyman in September and receive a special prize!

## **Reading Activities:**

**Musical Sight Words:** Write sight words on index cards and scatter on the floor. Play music. Child will walk around, stepping on the sight words. Stop music. Child reads sight word he/she is standing on.

**Sight Word Race:** 2 or more children look through book or other materials and find as many sight words as possible in 2 minutes. If just one child is playing, play game 2-3 times and see if player can find more words than previously.

**Hidden Sight Words:** Write sight words on index cards. Hide around the house or outside. Child will find cards and read the words as cards are found.

**Decodable Books:** For beginning readers, decodable books are better than leveled books because the emphasis is placed on sounding out words. Leveled readers focus on sight words. The websites below, have free decodable books (these are not official school resources):

### Math Activities:

Addition Matching Game: Index cards needed (or paper that you can't see through). One an index card write an addition equation. On another index card, write the answer. Do this for 10 problems and 10 answers. Place equations on one side and answers on the other. Play a matching game by matching the equation with the answer.

**Subtraction Matching Game:** Index cards needed (or paper that you can't see through). One an index card write a subtraction equation. On another index card, write the answer. Do this for 10 problems and 10 answers. Place equations on one side and answers on the other. Play a matching game by matching the equation with the answer.

**Snowball Battle:** Crumple 10 pieces of paper or use balled up socks. Give each person 5 snowballs. Each person will throw snowballs into their own large bowl. How many landed in each bowl? Add the number from each bowl to determine the total number. OPTIONAL: Play 10 rounds. Use tally marks to indicate who won each round. When done compare the numbers to see who won the most rounds.
